## THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF PELHAM

## BY-LAW #1071 (1986)

Being a by-law to prohibit and regulate the being at large or trespassing of animals, other than dogs.

WHEREAS this by-law is passed pursuant to the authority conferred by paragraphs 3 to 6 of Section 210 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 302;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF PELHAM ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) No person shall, within any part of the Town of Pelham, permit any horse, bull, ox, cow, sheep, goat, pig or other cattle under his ownership or control to be at large, or to trespass upon the property of others.
- (2) Mr. Jeff E. Robbins is hereby appointed poundkeeper for purposes of this by-law.
- (3) Where any horse, bull, ox, cow, sheep, goat, pig or other cattle is at large or trespassing contrary to Section (1) of this by-law, the same shall be impounded by the poundkeeper.
- (4) The following lands, namely Part of Lot 99 of the former Township of Thorold, consisting of ten (10) acres and owned by the said Mr. Jeff E. Robbins, are hereby designated as the enclosure for safekeeping of cattle impounded by the poundkeeper.
- (5) If any animal impounded by the poundkeeper pursuant to this by-law is not claimed within five (5) days after impounding, or if the damages, penalites and expenses imposed by this by-law or otherwise payable by law are not paid, the poundkeeper shall sell such animal.

- (6) A sale of animals by the poundkeeper shall be made in accordance with the provision of the Pounds Act, except that:
  - (a) the notices for the sale thereof under Section 10 of the Pounds Act shall be given by the poundkeeper within two (2) days after impounding; and
  - a copy of the notice of sale shall be mailed by prepaid ordinary mail to the last known address of the owner, if such owner be known to the poundkeeper.
- (7) Every person contravening Section (1) of this by-law shall pay:
- a penalty of \$20.00 for every animal at large or (1) trespassing, such penalty to be paid to the Treasurer of the Corporation; plus
- a fee of \$5.00 for the first day of impoundment by the poundkeeper and a fee of \$10.00 for the second and every subsequent day of impoundment, such fees to be paid to the poundkeeper.
- (8) The following allowances shall be paid to the poundkeeper, and are in addition to the fees set forth in Subsection (7) (2):
  - (1) \$25.00 per month
- (2) for preparation and delivery of the notice under Section 6 of the Pounds Act, the sum of \$2.00
- (3) for preparation of notices of sale and sale proceedings under Sections 10, 12 and 16 of the Pounds Act, the sum of \$10.00
- for travel necessarily incidental to the performance of (4) his duties, the rate per mile as established by Council
- (5) all actual disbursements, including the cost of food and water furnished to the cattle.
- Every fenceviewer required to decide the amount of damages under Section 17 of the Pounds Act shall be entitled to \$25.00 for each day or part thereof of attendance upon his duties.
- Except as varied by this by-law, the provisions of the Pounds (10)Act shall apply.
