BY-LAW NUMBER \_\_\_16 (1970)

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF PELHAM

TO CONTROL AND REGULATE THE USE OF THE TOWN REFUSE DISPOSAL AREA.

WHEREAS a Council of a local Municipality may pass bylaws for establishing a system for the collection, removal and disposal of garbage or other refuse under authority of Section 379 (1) paragraph 75 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1960 and amendments thereto, and

WHEREAS the Town of Pelham has established an area in Lot 9 Concession 7 for the disposal of garbage and refuse, and

WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Pelham deems it necessary and expedient to enact a by-law for the maintenance of the refuse disposal area.

THEREFORE the Council of the Town of Pelham enacts

as follows:

- 1) No person shall deposit in or upon the refuse disposal area any dead animals or fowl of any kind, car bodies or parts, household appliances, trees, stumps, septic tank effluent or night soil, farm produce in quantity, or such other matter which might give off odours or disease.
- 2) The disposal area shall be operated from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. daily, except Sundays and Statutory holidays at which days it shall be closed and barred by a gate.
- 3) No person or persons except residents of the Town of Pelham, or their agents, shall deposit any materials in the Town disposal area.
- 4) The Council is empowered to hire a caretaker or caretakers for the Town disposal area and to establish his remuneration and conditions of employment from time to time.
- 5) No person or persons shall hereafter establish a waste disposal area in the Town of Pelham without the written consent of the Council.
- 6) No person shall deposit any garbage or other refuse along the roadside in the Town of Pelham.
- 7) Any person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall forfeit and pay at the discretion of the convicting judge a penalty not exceeding \$300.00, exclusive of costs, and further that such penalty shall be recoverable under the Summary Convictions Act.
