

THE CORPORATION OF THE  
TOWN OF PELHAM  
BY-LAW #2444 (2002)

Being a by-law to re-enact various business licensing by-laws for the Town of Pelham.

WHEREAS prior to 1996, the Municipal Act provided for the licensing of various trades, callings, occupations and businesses, and

WHEREAS in 1996 the Municipal Act was amended under the Omnibus Bill, which provided for amendments to the business licensing provisions of the Act including a sunset provision of five (5) years, and

WHEREAS the New Municipal Act, 2001 comes into force on January 1, 2003 and sets out new criteria for the licensing of businesses by a municipality, and


WHEREAS Report No. C-17/02 was presented and approved by Council on December 16, 2002 directing the re-enactment of the licensing by-laws set out below prior to January 1, 2003, and


WHEREAS due to timing and the extensive review of the business licensing function that will be required in order to comply with the New Municipal Act, 2001 it is deemed expedient to re-enact all of the licensing by-laws of the Town of Pelham passed on or after January 1, 1996 thereby extending the force and effect of same until January 1, 2006 or their repeal, whichever comes first,

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF PELHAM ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) THAT the By-Law #1818 (1996) of the Town of Pelham, being a by-law to regulate and license refreshment vehicles, refreshment cycles and refreshment carts in the Town of Pelham, be and is hereby re-enacted pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.45, as amended, for the period ending January 1, 2006 or upon the by-law's repeal, whichever occurs first.
- (2) THAT By-law #1593 (1993), as amended, being a by-law to license, regulate and govern plumbers in the Town of Pelham, be and is hereby re-enacted pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.45, as amended, for the period ending January 1, 2006 or upon the by-law's repeal, whichever occurs first.
