

THE CORPORATION OF THE
T O W N O F P E L H A M
BY-LAW #463 (1978)

Being a by-law to alter the wards in the Town
of Pelham.

WHEREAS Council of the Town of Pelham is elected on a
ward basis;

AND WHEREAS Subsection 5 (a) of the Regional Municipality
of Niagara Act provides upon the application of an area municipality
authorized by a by-law of the Council thereof the Ontario Municipal
Board may by order,

"(b) Alter or dissolve any or all of the wards in the
area municipality and shall declare the date when
such alteration or dissolutions shall take effect."

AND WHEREAS Section 3, subsection (1) of the Regional
Municipality of Niagara Act provides that the Council of the Town
of Pelham shall be composed of a Mayor who shall be elected by
general vote and six aldermen to be elected by wards;

AND WHEREAS Council of the Town of Pelham deems it
desirable to alter the present ward boundaries to provide for
a more equable distribution of voters between the wards;

NOW THEREFORE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN
OF PELHAM ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

(1) Council of the Town of Pelham pursuant to the provisions
of the Regional Municipality of Niagara Act shall be composed of
a Mayor who shall be elected by a general vote and a total of
six aldermen whom shall be elected on a ward basis with two
aldermen to be elected from each ward.

(2) The present wards of the Town of Pelham shall be altered
as follows:

(a) Lots 10 and 11 of Concessions 4, 5 and 6 inclusive
shall be placed in Ward #1 from Ward #2.

(b) Lots 3, 4 and 5 of Concessions 9 and 10 inclusive
shall be placed in Ward #2 from Ward #3.

(3) The description of the altered wards shall be as set
out in Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this by-law.

(4) This by-law shall be applicable for all elections of Council
held after the passing thereof by Council.

(5) That application to the Ontario Municipal Board for an order approving the provisions of this by-law be made forthwith.
