THE CORPORATION OF THE

TOWN O F PELHAM

BY-LAW #550 (1979)

Being a by-law to amend By-law #14 (1979), as amended, to provide for the establishment of 1½% rate for penalty and interest on taxes.

WHEREAS Section 527 (3) and 553 (1) of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1970, as amended, authorize the Municipal Council to pass a by-law to establish a rate of $1\frac{1}{2}\%$ per month on arrears of taxes and late payment of current years taxes;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF PELHAM ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- (1)Section 2 of By-law #14 (1970) be repealed.
- Section 4 of By+law #14 (1970) be repealed and the following (2) is hereby substituted:
 - "4. That a subdivision of the items of taxation where the total amount of claim for taxes exceeds \$50.00 shall be made and become payable in four installments with the first two installments to be equal to the installments of the interim bill and the balance of the bill to be divided evenly and shown as the third and fourth installments with the installments to be payable in accordance with the dates set out in the levy by-law."
- (3) Section 5 of By-law #14 (1970) be repealed and the following is hereby substituted:
 - That penalties at the rate of one and one quarter per cent $(1\frac{1}{4}\%)$ per month will be added for non-payment of taxes on due dates set out in the levy by-law, calculated to the time of payment of taxes during the current year; the amount of penalty will be calculated and added to the tax account on the 1st. day of each month."
- (4) Section 7 of By-law #14 (1970) as amended by By-law #17 (1970) be repealed and the following is hereby substituted:
 - "7. That after the 31st. day of December of current year, interest at the rate of one and one quarter per cent $(1\frac{1}{4}\%)$ per month will be added on the 1st. day of each month until the taxes are paid."
- (5) Sections 3 and 4 of this by-law come into force and take effect January 1st., 1980.
