

THE CORPORATION OF THE
T O W N O F P E L H A M
BY-LAW #643 (1980)

Being a by-law to provide for the notification
of resident electors of the location of the
polling place.

WHEREAS the Municipal Elections Act, R.S.O. 1977, Section 46,
Subsections 7 and 8, as amended, provides as follows:

(7) In municipalities having more than 5,000 electors, the
Clerk shall advise each elector of the location of the polling
place in which that elector is to vote:

(a) in the case of a resident elector, by mailing or causing
to be delivered to the elector a notice of the location of such
polling place; and,

(b) in the case of a non-resident elector, by mailing to the
elector a notice of the location of such polling place.

(8) Notwithstanding clause (a) of subsection 7, the Council
of a municipality having more than 5,000 electors may, by
By-law passed not later than the first day of September of
an election year, provide that the Clerk shall advise each
resident elector of the location of the polling place at
which that elector is to vote by mailing or causing to be
delivered to the address of the elector a notice of the
location of such polling place, which notice shall be
directed to all the electors at that address.

AND WHEREAS the municipality of the Town of Pelham has more than
5,000 electors;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF
PELHAM ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

(1) The Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Pelham be and the
same is hereby authorized to advise each resident elector of the location of
the polling place at which that elector is to vote by mailing or causing to
be delivered to the address of the elector, a notice of the location of such
polling place, which notice shall be directed to all the electors at that
address.
